## Aéroports de Paris December 2009 traffic figures

### Passenger traffic

In December 2009, passenger traffic at Aéroports de Paris dropped by 2.5% compared with December 2008. Paris airports handled a total of 6.4 million passengers divided up between 4.4 million for Paris-Charles de Gaulle (-2.2%) and nearly 2.0 million for Paris-Orly (-3.2%). December traffic was affected, between 17 and 21 December, by adverse weather conditions which hit France and Europe, particularly Germany and Great Britain.

- International traffic (excluding Europe) decreased by 1.6%. Traffic on routes to and from Africa increased by 1.3%. Traffic on North American routes fell by 7.3% while Latin America dropped by 1.7%. On Middle Eastern routes, traffic increased by 1.0% while Asia decreased by 0.3%;
- European traffic (excluding France) fell by 2.5% including -1.6% on Schengen routes and -6.1% for the British and Irish markets;
- Domestic traffic decreased by 4.8%;
- The number of connecting passengers decreased by 9.0% in December 2009 compared with December 2008 resulting in a connecting rate of 24.5% (against 26.1% in December 2008).

For the full year 2009, Aéroports de Paris handled 83.0 million passengers, a 4.7% decrease in traffic which is mainly due to the impact of the economic crisis on air transport. For the same period, the number of connecting passengers decreased by 3.5% resulting in a connecting rate of 24.7% (against 24.4% for the year 2008).

### Aircraft movements

The number of aircraft movements decreased by 6.3% in December year on year (-7.0% at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and -4.5% at Paris-Orly).

For the full year 2009, the number of aircraft movements decreased by 5.5%.
